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I have the privilege of sharing the text of the speech, Keely gave at the Director's Principals' Gathering where she received the award for highest ATAR in the Maitland Newcastle Diocese:

It is such a privilege to receive this award today. It means a lot to me because I see this as a reflection of the hard work that went into my HSC, and when I say 'hard work' I'm not just talking about the effort that I put in, but I'm also referring to the effort of the people I was so lucky to be surrounded by.

I have always felt comfortable, supported and valued as a member of the St Paul's community and I think that when you feel that within a school it makes reaching your potential a lot more achievable. I remember being very nervous when I started High School. I came from St Kevin's at Cardiff, a lovely little primary school where every staff member knew the name of every student. I found it hard to believe that I would feel that same sense of community at my new school. But eventually, I did. I have had some incredible teachers throughout my time at St Paul's, teachers who believed in me and encouraged me to pursue the many opportunities that St Paul's offers its students, not just academically but also in the cultural and sporting aspects of school life. One of the many wonderful things about attending a 7-12 school are the special relationships you build with your teachers and year group and it is for this reason that St Paul's will always be a very special place for me.

I also want to thank my family; my mum, dad and little sister Lara for all their support over the HSC year. They walked on eggshells for about 12 months and put up with my stress, my doubts and everything that comes with living with a HSC student. It wasn't easy and I know that it must have been very frustrating but I know that if it wasn't for their support, patience and guidance I wouldn't have gotten through the HSC, let alone be attending this ceremony today.

And finally I'd like to thank the CSO for inviting us here to celebrate our results today and for everything you do for our schools in the diocese. While I'm looking forward to starting University and seeing what the future holds, there will always be a part of me that is attached to and misses St Paul's. It's a fantastic school from which I have gained so much and under the guidance of my teachers and the Executive, I believe I have grown both as a student and a person. I feel truly blessed to have been a student in this diocese and I will be eternally grateful for the education and opportunities I have received throughout my time here.

BoSTES and ATAR Information Evening

Thank you to our many parents and Year 12 students who attended our information evening last week. At a very busy time for everyone, it was great to see so many students and families willing to invest this time in developing an understanding of the HSC and ATAR processes. I have placed a copy of the PowerPoint on the portal for your further consideration. If there are any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me.



Year 12 have received their assessment calendars for the remainder of the year and an up-to-date version is maintained at all times through the portal. There is an important variation to this calendar in 2016, in that we have reduced our mid-course assessment period to just two days (Monday March 14 and Tuesday March 15). Most assessments have been reduced in size and placed within the regular teaching term in an attempt to minimise the time lost by students during elongated examination blocks. Our hope is that this increased amount of face-to-face time will yield some positive outcomes for all students.

On the two specified assessment days, students will only need to attend school to undertake their actual tasks – a separate timetable for these two days will be provided to students this week.

Year 7 Information Evening

Thank you to both parents and students who attended this evening on Monday. A collaborative approach to learning often heralds the beginning of a good educative journey and therefore we believe such nights are imperative within the St Paul's community. Thank you for taking the time out of your busy schedules to join us.

Assessment Handbooks





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Year 11 News

It is pleasing to see the majority of students have settled in well to the routine of senior school. The **Tutor Group representatives and SRC representatives** were inducted at the Opening School Mass on February 16 with Bishop Bill, while the large number of **Transport Monitors** received their badges at the recent Form meeting. At next week's Year 11 Form meeting all students will receive their St Paul's senior school badge.



Last week Year 11 students received their very detailed **Assessment Handbooks**. It is important that students review the calendar for the Preliminary Year and note the dates of their assessment tasks and the weightings. These dates should then be entered into student phones with reminders one or two weeks in advance. Even posting a copy on the family fridge might be one way of alerting parents about 'stress periods'. The due date for payment for the **Year 11 Study Day on 10th March** is fast approaching. The outside agency "Learn4Life" is used for this day, and given that the HSC is a memory based exam it is important that students have access to a range of techniques to assist their memory retention. The cost of \$14 is a small investment for what could be valuable strategies to assist learning.

All **subject changes** should now be finalised, with the exception of students dropping levels within a subject, for example English Advanced to English Standard. Changes within the subject can continue until the end of the Preliminary Year. It is important where changes have been made, that students attempt to catch up on work missed and liaise closely with the teacher.

Last year as part of the End of Year program, students undertook the RYDA Driver Training Day at the Adamstown Driving Range. In August this year students will travel to the **Bstreetsmart Day** at All phones Arena. Further details will be forthcoming.

Finally, welcome aboard to those Year 11 students who in recent weeks have returned to St Paul's or who have joined us from other regional High Schools. St Paul's has a safe and accepting culture, and encourages academic excellence. Be a part of this – grasp every opportunity that comes your way!




