Record of School Achievement RoSA

The RoSA shows a student's comprehensive record of academic achievement, which includes:

- completed courses and the awarded grade or mark
- courses a student has participated in but did not complete before leaving school
- results of any minimum standard literacy and numeracy tests that may have been sat
- Stage 5 (Year 10) and Stage 6 (Year 11) courses, the student has satisfactorily completed.

Satisfactory Completion of Course Requirements

Follow approved course

- Apply yourself with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course.
- Achieve some or all of the course outcomes.

Satisfactory completion includes such things as:

- attendance pattern
- level of involvement in class
- effort
- assignments
- homework completed
- and level of achievement



Unsatisfactory Course Completion

If a student is in danger of not completing a course:

- A written warning will be given
- Opportunity will be given to correct any problem, or make up outstanding work.
- If no improvement occurs an "N" determination will be awarded.
- 'N' Determinations will have a serious impact on qualification for the Record of Student Achievement (ROSA).

NAPLAN 2020

- The National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9, in schools across Australia.
- NAPLAN assesses writing, language conventions, reading and numeracy.
- In 2020 NAPLAN tests will once again be online
- NAPLAN results will help you understand how your child is progressing through school.


