

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It seems a very long time ago that I sat at my computer to write a newsletter to our community and I suppose that is true. Much has happened in the past few months including lock-down, remote learning, Year 12 final days and much more. In reality, my last article would have been back in Term One before I took leave. On my return at the beginning of this term, I wrote to the community thanking you all for allowing me to have the renewal time that I needed. I feel good about my return and it is wonderful to be back with friends and colleagues.

The return to school for our students has been very smooth. Like the return that happened last year, I think that the vast majority were keen to get back to face to face learning with their friends. The current mask restriction has been accepted well by the students, but I will admit, it does make us all rather tired at the end of the day. There is nothing better than breathing fresh air! I do feel for our Year 12 students who are also required to wear masks during their exams, but I suppose that they are all in the same boat as every other Year 12 student sitting the exams.

We were able to stage a lovely Farewell to our HSC Class of 2021 culminating with the Final Awards Ceremony and Liturgy. It needed to be a tightly choreographed affair and I would like to publicly thank all the amazing staff who worked so hard to make the events happen so seamlessly. I suspect that when we all got into teaching, we would never have predicted that we would become stage managers, choreographers, directors, set designers, video technicians and sound and lighting experts! The students were so giving of their time and willingness to support what we were trying to do for them under very challenging public health orders. The final thank you goes to Blair Brownlee and Jess Dufty, the Year 12 Leaders of Wellbeing and Engagement who have guided this group through two years of great challenge.

The HSC has commenced with rules and regulations that reflect the time. At the point of writing, English and Music are now complete and by all reports they have been fair and reasonable papers where the students have been able to show their learning appropriately. I hope that I am able to report the same as the exams continue.

COVID restrictions have resulted in many modifications to the ways that we do everyday things including our sports program. At this point we will continue to hold extra lessons on Friday afternoon and include some extra PE lessons for juniors as we can. The biggest hurdle we have is that we cannot mix cohorts and we can only have large groups together outside which makes the use of our hall problematic. I hope and pray that after the HSC is over, the health orders become more school friendly. We continue to follow the COVID regulations with cleaning and mask wearing along with attempted social distancing! In reality, this is the most challenging aspect for all schools, and I suspect the rule makers have a very rose-coloured view of how young people operate. In relation to mask wearing, I do ask that you have a conversation with your children about the need to wear masks on public transport. This includes all school busses and trains. I was speaking to one of the bus drivers earlier in the week and he reported that some of our students are reluctant to follow that particular health order. I thank you for your support.

On Wednesday afternoon this week we also hosted our Year 11 Awards Ceremony. We held the awards in Holland Court (an outside venue) and it was a lovely occasion. Congratulations to all our award winners. Thank you to Mr Cayte Pryor and her support team for organising the event.

The term is moving on very quickly. We are trying to work out how we might be able to have End of Year Activities. Mrs Shipman and a group of teachers are meeting regularly and are in contact with venues that might be able to support the College in having the activities in the final week of the year. More information will be coming out soon.

Enjoy the longer days. I hope that you are able to avoid any storms that seem to be about this time of the year.




