## Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

#### **HSC Trial Examinations**

Year 12 commence the HSC Trial examinations on Monday with English Standard and English Advanced Paper 1. The examination timetable is available on Compass along with Student Responsibilities for Examinations. Students are expected to be familiar with the arrangements for examinations. The HSC Trial examinations are an opportunity for students to rehearse for the HSC which includes preparing for an examination block and managing the examination 'stress'. A certain level of stress is normal and students have been provided with strategies and techniques to assist in managing this stress through the Elevate workshops. Students can also manage stress by establishing a regular pattern of revision and seeking feedback on their understanding from their teachers. Even if a student has not established an effective pattern of preparation leading to the HSC Trial examinations, they have several months before the HSC to reflect and refine their approach. Teachers will be working closely with students to prepare a gap analysis of the HSC Trial examinations and to identify goals for improvement.

The HSC can also be thought of as a team effort. When each student brings their best to the Trial HSC and final examinations, then a collective sense of excellence is cultivated. I often refer to the phrase 'marks in the bucket' when speaking with students about the importance of treating the HSC as a collective effort. This does not mean that one student's result directly affects the whole group. Rather, this phrase refers to the influence we have on each other to give our best effort. This is particularly important when some students have already secured a post-school pathway such as early entry to university, an apprenticeship or employment. These are applaudable achievements, however, all students have a responsibility to maintain the effort in striving for their best because that positive approach will lift the whole group.

#### **NAPLAN Student Results**


The NAPLAN students results have been received by the College and will be posted to families next week. This year, new proficiency standards with 4 levels of achievement for each year level replaced the previous 10-band structure that covered all 4 levels tested and the old national minimum standard set in 2008 when tests were on paper.

The standard for proficiency is set at a challenging but reasonable level. If your child is in the Strong or Exceeding category, it means they have demonstrated proficiency and that their literacy or numeracy skills are where they should be at this stage of their schooling. If your child has not yet achieved proficiency, then they will either be in the Developing category or the Needs additional support category. The proficiency standards have already proved useful as we have analysed results and identified students who require intervention to improve their literacy and numeracy skills. While a useful measure, NAPLAN results also need to be placed into perspective within the wider context of learning at the College. NAPLAN tests are point in time tests and do not encapsulate the uniqueness and exceptionality of each individual student. The strengths and gifts of students are not measured through point in time tests and while teachers may use this information to implement targeted interventions, it is only part of the complexity of meeting the needs of each student.






