We wish Kirrily all the best for the next round of the competition.






# Yr 12 Numeracy & Work Studies Excursion

Our Year 12 Numeracy and Work Studies classes completed their final assessment task today. They were required to plan and implement their own excursion – including lodging the excursion request for approval, completing WHS risk assessments, reading timetables to determine public transport to be used and appropriate run sheets for the day, as well as developing a budget to include all costs.

The students did a fantastic job, all taking turns to lead the navigation from St Pauls to the Powerhouse Museum and keep the group to our timetable. There were no wrong turns taken, and only one student who ran out of money for the return train. (Don't worry, we got them home safely and legally).

The students reported the excursion was a great success. They appreciated the opportunity to show their leadership abilities and improve their teamwork skills. The teachers were incredibly proud of how well these students ran the day, including ensuring that Mrs Richardson was home in time to take her daughter to swimming lessons.

This assessment has pulled together many of the meaningful skills taught across Numeracy and Work Studies, with students demonstrating their knowledge of workplace safety, networking, timing, workplace procedures, event coordination and leadership skills.

# Student Laptops 2024

#### **Student Laptops 2024**

Since 2019, St Paul's has engaged a supplier to provide a parent portal for easy ordering and payment of Student laptop devices. Whilst previously this was only open to Yr 6 and Yr 9 families, we will be taking orders from any students at St Paul's this year for 2024. Next Technologies are a leader in student devices and technology for schools with over 30 years of experience. They have worked closely with Diocesan schools since 2018 in supplying BYOD devices.

The portal can be found at: Home - St Paul's 2024 BYOD Purchasing Portal (byodschools.com.au) Whilst we recognise that many students already have a laptop from Primary school, this remains an additional option for families looking to purchase a laptop for student use at St Paul's Catholic College. There are significant advantages if you purchase one of these devices for student use. The chosen devices have been selected based upon their designation by HP as an "Education" device – stronger hinges for multiple openings each day, rounded corners and stronger edges, "drop" and pressure tested, a "garaged" pen for ease of use and avoid losing it, spill and damage resistant keyboards, increased performance over similar retail models and standardised USB-C charging.




