PPEP Talk®

On Tuesday 14th November, all Year 10 female (female assigned at birth) students will be involved in an information session regarding Periods, Pain and Endometriosis, presented by the Pelvic Pain Foundation of Australia during period 4. The PPEP Talk is a curriculum-linked health and wellbeing



education program delivered with a fun, medically accurate and age-appropriate approach. It incorporates the modern neuroscience of pain, and is of benefit to all students, particularly the 1 in 4 girls and people assigned female at birth with severe period pain.

Approximately half of these girls and people assigned female at birth will develop endometriosis during their teens and twenties. The Program, lasting one hour, is delivered by fully trained educators and incorporates animation, video and interactive components. It includes specifically developed resources for use during the session and resources for girls with pain to take home and discuss with their parents.

Year 11 First Aid Course

Last Friday, 50 students from Year 11 participated in a First Aid Course. The course included the completion of a pre-learning booklet, followed by an information session with practical assessments. All students were incredible throughout the day and successfully accredited with a First Aid Certificate.

The Tea Towel Project




"The Tea Towel Project" Years 7 to 10.


