Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

Finishing Well

Earlier this week a student reminded me that after this week we only have 16 days of school before End Of Year Activities start – that is 16 days of lessons and learning at school! As we look ahead to the end of the year it is important to remember there is still teaching and learning to be done before we can put the books away and enjoy our break. For students this means to maintain organisation like bringing a charged device everyday and to make sur they have all the necessary equipment to allow them to engage in the learning opportunities presented to them. This is one way students can set themselves up to finish the year well.

Curriculum Reform

The NSW education system is reforming the curriculum which is taught in all classrooms from Kindergarten to Year 12. The new curriculum, as a result of the NSW Curriculum Reform, will give students more time to focus on key learning areas so that they can acquire a deeper understanding of central concepts. It will ensure students develop strong foundations for learning, life and work in a complex and fast-changing world.


This reform has been informed by extensive research and consultation with families, teachers and education experts. New syllabuses will provide us with a unique opportunity to re-focus and place curriculum at the heart of our school planning.

Along with significant changes to the K-2 English and mathematics syllabuses, key curriculum changes include:

- · an entirely new curriculum from 2022 with new syllabuses focused on what is essential to know and do in early and middle years of schooling, and key learning areas in the senior years.
- \cdot providing more time for teaching by reducing the hours teachers spend on extra-curricular topics and issues and compliance requirements.
- · strengthening post- school pathways with new learning areas for Years 11 and 12 that clearly link learning to future employment and study options.

The new curriculum will ensure every student develops strong foundations for learning, life and work. The reforms are vital for the young people in our schools today, and for those who will arrive in the years to come.

Throughout the year the Mathematics, English and TAS faculties have been working towards implementing new syllabuses in Year 7 and Year 9. Next year Creative Arts And Languages (CAAL), Science, and PDHPE faculties will be planning for implementation of new syllabuses in 2025. Throughout this time of transition, we remember that our theme is 'We Get To ...', as in we get to re-imagine what learning can look like in our schools, not 'we have to ...'.



Year 7-10 Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT)

7-10 students have completed PAT over the past two weeks. These tests, which focus on mathematics and reading, are used by teachers to identify areas of strengths in these domains for cohorts and for individual students along with identifying areas for growth. The information obtained from the tests does not contribute to students' grades and is just one indicator used for future planning in teaching and learning.



2024 HSC Academic Guide

Year 11 students were issued the 2024 HSC Academic Guide earlier in the term along with the NESA HSC Rules and Procedures booklet. The Academic Guide outlines the College Assessment Policy and Procedures and also includes the Assessment Schedules for each course. An outline of the information within these documents was presented to students along with the following resources to help keep them on track throughout the HSC year. Students are reminded of their responsibilities as an HSC student in completing classwork and assessments to the best of their ability. Year 10 Stage 6 Transition Program

In week 9 this term, Year 10 students will engage in learning similar to what they will experience in their selected Stage 6 courses next year. We will be running a week of Stage 6 lessons in week 9 and students will be learning about the skills and capabilities needed for each of their courses. Importantly, during this week, students will complete All My Own Work (AMOW) which is a requirement of NESA before students can be enrolled in their Stage 6 courses next year. Student attendance during this week is expected and if they miss the AMOW session they will be required to attend school one afternoon to ensure they have the necessary information to commence their Stage 6 studies. 


