Both students have demonstrated tenacity and resilience in their studies and should be extremely proud of their efforts. We at St Pauls are certainly very proud of them.




Holly Kehoe has shown great resilience and tenacity with her external studies and her efforts have once again bee recognised with a nomination of SHAPE. Congratulations Holly!


