In the coming weeks, the College will host its first Parent / Carer Engagement Meeting for 2024 (formerly known as Parents & Friends Association Meeting).

In recent years there has been a small number of parents and carers who have participated in these forums. At our last meeting of 2023, a general discussion centred around how to engage further families in the discussions at the Parent / Carer Engagement Meetings. This discussion was focused around one of the College's goals for its current Strategic Plan which is to foster 'engagement with broader community members and organisations'. As a result of these discussions, it was determined I would write to all families prior to the first meeting in 2024 to outline the general purpose of the meeting as well as provide an overview of the information communicated during the gatherings.

Authentic and productive and relationships between schools and families are the foundation of positive outcomes for students, families, and schools. I understand many parents and carers engage with the College in other ways for example, Parent, Student and Teacher Conferences and Subject Selection events, however, the Parent / Carer Engagement Meetings allows for more global dialogue and insights into the operation of the College.

The Parent and Carer Engagement Meetings occur on a Tuesday evening in Week 8 each term. They commence at 6pm and usually conclude by 7pm. These meetings are held online, however there is an option for parents / carers to attend in person. During the meetings information is provided by the Principal and Assistant Principals, these presentations are related to the Religious dimension of the College as well as the learning and wellbeing domains. During these presentations there are opportunities for those present to ask questions or provide feedback on initiatives.

The diocese has a Parents and Friends Association, and two parents of St Paul's represent the College at these diocesan meetings. These representatives provide feedback at our meetings each term of discussions at these diocesan gatherings.

Parents and Carers attending the meetings are not required to undertake fundraising activities or be involved in volunteering to coordinate school events. The general principles of the meetings are to be consultative and informative for those who attend the forums.

Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

It is hard to believe we are over half way through the term, however much has been done over the past six weeks to support student learning. Learning at St Paul's is characteristic of a school wide approach in using data to inform our strategic direction. Leaders of Learning have worked through analysing the 2023 HSC results of subjects in their Key Learning Areas using a rigorous analysis system to identify areas of success and areas for improvement. Next week students in Years 7 & 9 will sit NAPLAN tests. The schedule for these tests are below. The data from these tests will be used to identify and plan for individual needs of students and areas of improvement for student cohorts in the areas of writing, reading, numeracy and conventions of language. Formative and summative assessment is taking place across all year groups in the school. I encourage students to share the feedback they receive with you so that together we can work to build a culture of continuous improvement.

Assessment

A link to the Assessment Guide for each year group has now been sent to students and parents/carers. These handbooks are located on the school website and include both the procedures for assessment and the assessment schedules for each course. It is students' responsibility to know the procedures for assessment for their year group. It is important that students follow the procedures and if they are unsure of any aspect they ask a member of staff in advance of an assessment task's date for submission. AIM forms (Accident/ Illness/Misadventure) are available in hard copies at Student Reception or can be downloaded from the school website.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.

In preparation for NAPLAN 2024, students in Years 7 & 9 were given the opportunity to complete Practice tests to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. Students and parents can access from home the <u>public demonstration site (https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site)</u> if they would like to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available.





2024 School Fee Information

School fees comprise of Resource, Tuition, Diocesan Family School Building Levy (DFSBL), Camps/Retreats and Electives and are the responsibility of parents/carers of students enrolled at the school.

Tuition Fees Year 7-10 \$2033, Year 11-12 \$3089

The Diocesan Tuition Fee is set each year by the Diocese.

Family discount on full rate diocesan tuition fees is available to parents who have more than one child attending a Catholic School in this Diocese.

- 1 child family 0% full rate
- 2 child family 15% each child
- 3 child family 25% each child
- 4 + child family 50% each child

Concessions on Tuition fees are also given to account holders of a current Health Care/Pension card. An application form must be completed along with providing a copy of original card.

Diocesan Family & School Building Levy (DFSBL) \$1638

The DFSBL is charged to the oldest child for each family. The levy is pooled to contribute towards past, present and future costs for building projects across all existing schools, and for the development of new Catholic schools within the Diocese.

Resource Fees Year 7-10 \$860, Year 11-12 \$810

The resource costs are set by each individual school. Fees are used to pay school resources, educational activities, student textbooks, various low cost excursions/incursions, photocopying, computer technology and amenities.

Elective Fees Year 9-12

Students who choose to undertake specific subjects, will be required to pay additional charges per year to cover specific expenses associated with the individual subject.

Retreats/ Camps

The Year 7 & 9 Camp and 10 & 12 Retreat are compulsory, and it is expected that all students attend as per conditions of enrolment in a Catholic school. Costings are calculated based on all students attending, venues and buses have to be paid when booking is first made. Your understanding of this would be very much appreciated.

Friday Sport Payment & Consent

For your convenience, you can now consent and pay for your child's Friday sport through Compass each Term. The account holder (name on your statement) is the only one who can access Compass to make these payments, if you would like joint access to Compass so both parents can make payments please complete and return the attached joint access form.

The Catholic Schools Office declares that genuine inability to meet tuition and other fees does not exclude access to a school within the system by a child of a family genuinely committed to Catholic faith and practice.

For families experiencing financial hardship or wishing to discuss other payment arrangements please contact the College Principal or Finance Office to make an appointment. These discussions and arrangements regarding fees are strictly confidential.

The collection of all school fees is to ensure the best possible learning environment for your child.

Account Statements

All fees are billed yearly in February, and it is recommended a regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalment is made from February to November to ensure your account is fully paid by 30 November, 2024. Our preferred method of payment is via Bpay (BPay detail are on your monthly statement) however fees may also be paid via EFT, Credit card, cheque and Centrepay. If you require assistance with calculating your weekly, fortnightly or monthly payment amount, please email finance@booragul.catholic.edu.au

2024 School fee account can be viewed at any time through Compass and updated statement are emailed at the beginning of each month. Families who have a nil balance will not receive a statement.


