Lord, as we journey together at St Paul's, Help us to grow, guided by the teachings of Jesus, The writings of St Paul and the traditions of our faith.


Create in us a generous heart,

DramaFest

On the 6th of May Ms Burt, Mrs Patterson and 24 Drama students from Years 8 to 12 travelled to the Town Hall in Newcastle to spend a day working with other Drama students from across the diocese and industry professionals for DramaFest run by ASPIRE. Students participated in workshops including puppetry, stage combat, monologue, characterisation and physical theatre. All students who attended the workshops enjoyed the day and said that the workshops complemented what they were doing in the classroom.

DIODRAMA

Anna Kerrigan ASPIRE director spent two days, 9th May and 30th May workshopping, developing and rehearsing our Diodrama production with 30 drama students from Years 8 to 12 in our drama space. The result was 'Mysteries, Mazes and D Grade Celebrities'. This play is what happens when a distant member of the royal family, a politician, a rockstar grieving the love of their life, a background actor and many more interesting characters find themselves stuck in the set of a reality television show. Not just any reality show, a haunted house where budget cuts have been made and the employees are both cooky and incompetent. This collaboration with the amazing Anna Kerrigan and Drama students from Years 8 to 12 from St Pauls Catholic College takes a look at societies obsession with catching that "moment" in the media for entertainment's sake, with a few digs at the state of the economy at the same time. We were very excited to

be involved in DioDrama with St Pius for the second year in a row, the professional theatrical experience we have in the Civic Playhouse, experimenting with the elements of production and devising a play from scratch gives us a holistic experience of the theatrical world complementing our study of Drama in the classroom. We had our technical rehearsal on Tuesday 11th June and our performance Wednesday 12th June at 6pm.

The desire to express ourselves is a connection with our deepest creative roots: a signal from the ice age where human beings loved drawing on walls. In the ice age people pressed their hands against cave walls and spat ochre pigment to create a red outline. A similar technique to that used today when street artists spray paint over a pre-cut stencil to leave a quick image. Street art mystically returns to the primal urge to make a mark on a blank surface.

2024 School Fee Information

School fees comprise of Resource, Tuition, Diocesan Family School Building Levy (DFSBL), Camps/Retreats and Electives and are the responsibility of parents/carers of students enrolled at the school.

Tuition Fees Year 7-10 \$2033, Year 11-12 \$3089

The Diocesan Tuition Fee is set each year by the Diocese.

Family discount on full rate diocesan tuition fees is available to parents who have more than one child attending a Catholic School in this Diocese.

- 1 child family 0% full rate
- 2 child family 15% each child
- 3 child family 25% each child
- 4 + child family 50% each child

Concessions on Tuition fees are also given to account holders of a current Health Care/Pension card. An application form must be completed along with providing a copy of original card.

Diocesan Family & School Building Levy (DFSBL) \$1638

The DFSBL is charged to the oldest child for each family. The levy is pooled to contribute towards past, present and future costs for building projects across all existing schools, and for the development of new Catholic schools within the Diocese.

Resource Fees Year 7-10 \$860, Year 11-12 \$810

The resource costs are set by each individual school. Fees are used to pay school resources, educational activities, student textbooks, various low cost excursions/incursions, photocopying, computer technology and amenities.

Elective Fees Year 9-12

Students who choose to undertake specific subjects, will be required to pay additional charges per year to cover specific expenses associated with the individual subject.

Retreats/ Camps

The Year 7 & 9 Camp and 10 & 12 Retreat are compulsory, and it is expected that all students attend as per conditions of enrolment in a Catholic school. Costings are calculated based on all students attending, venues and buses have to be paid when booking is first made. Your understanding of this would be very much appreciated.

Friday Sport Payment & Consent

For your convenience, you can now consent and pay for your child's Friday sport through Compass each Term. The account holder (name on your statement) is the only one who can access Compass to make these payments, if you would like joint access to Compass so both parents can make payments please complete and return the attached joint access form.

The Catholic Schools Office declares that genuine inability to meet tuition and other fees does not exclude access to a school within the system by a child of a family genuinely committed to Catholic faith and practice.

For families experiencing financial hardship or wishing to discuss other payment arrangements please contact the College Principal or Finance Office to make an appointment. These discussions and arrangements regarding fees are strictly confidential.

The collection of all school fees is to ensure the best possible learning environment for your child.

Account Statements

All fees are billed yearly in February, and it is recommended a regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalment is made from February to November to ensure your account is fully paid by 30 November, 2024. Our preferred method of payment is via Bpay (BPay detail are on your monthly statement) however fees may also be paid via EFT, Credit card, cheque and Centrepay. If you require assistance with calculating your weekly, fortnightly or monthly payment amount, please email finance@booragul.catholic.edu.au

2024 School fee account can be viewed at any time through Compass and updated statement are emailed at the beginning of each month. Families who have a nil balance will not receive a statement.


