PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT GUIDELINES FOR TAS SUBJECTS



In accordance with the WHS Policy and PPE Policy, appropriate Personal Protective Equipment must be worn by staff, students and visitors to ensure their safety in identified workspaces.

ENCLOSED LEATHER FOOTWEAR Areas where enclosed leather footwear (or other material confirmed by the manufacturer to be suitable) is required are: ☐ Workshop areas □ Kitchen areas Sandals, canvas/mesh footwear or high heeled shoes are not permitted in these areas. If students present for a class or activity with inappropriate footwear the student should be offered alternative educational activities until they are wearing appropriate footwear. **SAFETY GLASSES** Appropriate eye protection must be worn at all times in: ☐ Workshop areas Appropriate eye protection may also be identified as a requirement in relation to other areas or activities, documented procedure or a documented risk assessment. **APRONS** Areas where aprons may be recommended are: ☐ Workshop areas

LONG HAIR

□ Kitchen areas

Students with long hair must keep their hair tied and secured so that it cannot become entangled in machinery or equipment, caught on fire when exposed to open flames or contaminate food.

PLEASE NOTE

Additional PPE such as **HEARING PROTECTION** and **DUST MASKS** may be a requirement for identified activities.

PPE must be kept in good condition and worn correctly at all times.
