To the Families and Friends of the St Paul's Community.....

Last week, the staff met for their annual **Spirituality Retreat** at the Mercure Conference Centre in the Hunter Valley. The presenter, **Greg Sunter** from Queensland is a well-known and well-regarded retreat and reflection facilitator and inservice presenter on a wide range of topics including Religious Education, Theology, Scripture, Spirituality, Catholic Ethos, Prayer, and Ministry with Young People.



Through his business, **WholeHearted**, Greg also offers public retreat experiences grounded in the work of American educator and author, Parker J Palmer. He is a Courage and Renewal facilitator, prepared by the Center for Courage and Renewal. Greg is the author of several books on adolescent faith and has presented at numerous conferences. Greg writes for liturgyhelp.com and his gospel reflections appear in Catholic parish bulletins and newsletters around Australia, U.K. and the U.S.



On our day, Greg led the staff in a deep reflection of what it means to teach in a Catholic School with St Paul as our patron saint. The day was a wonderful experience for all the staff and I would like to publically thank **Michael Doyle** and our terrific Office Support staff who did so much to make the day a meaningful and enlightening day.

The new building is progressing well and over last week and this week, the teaching staff have been preparing to move into the new staff study and lounge areas. The remainder of the building is still being finished as is the landscaping and drainage on the outside. It will take a few weeks for us to settle into the new facility and I am sure that we will have teething problems but as with anything of this scale, it takes time and patience for all the multitude of factors to be solved and for all the systems to be up and running. The Administration side will most likely be operational in the early part of next term. At this stage, we hope to have an official opening some time in Term 4.

Along with the move, staff are busy with final assessments and report writing. **Years 7 to 10 reports are currently being prepared and these reports will be issued electronically for the first time.** We trialled our recent Year 11 reports this way and the trial proved successful. At this stage, all going well, we will issue the junior reports via a **dedicated Parent Portal**. More information will be provided once reports are completed and ready to issue. Obviously, it goes without saying that parents who are unable to receive reports electronically will be appropriately provided for.

I would like to wish all of our **Year 12 students** the best of luck as they begin their major exams next week. I deliberately did not refer to them as a "**Trial**". This term is a hangover from many years ago – in fact I would suggest almost 30 years ago when we did a trial exam in preparation for the HSC. We also



Year 12 HSC Trial Exams

Year 12 Students and parents are reminded that the Year 12 HSC Trial Examinations are being held from **Monday 19 until Thursday 29 June 2017**. All students have received their timetables and there is a copy of this timetable on the *School Portal under Student Documents – Assessment*. Students are reminded of the following procedures for exams:

- ⇒ *Students need only be at school when examinations are on. Misreading the exam timetable will not be an acceptable excuse for being late or missing an exam.*
- ⇒ *Students should ensure that they arrive **at least 15 minutes before** the commencement time for their scheduled exam, and **remain until the exam's conclusion**.*
- ⇒ *Students attending school outside of exam times are **expected to use the Library facility** for private study where the Library is available.*
- ⇒ *Students missing an examination for any reason must ensure that the **Absence, Illness, Misadventure Procedures** are carried out. **Notification to the school at the time of the exam, and subsequent completion of the appropriate Absence, Illness, Misadventure forms are mandatory requirements of this procedure.***
- ⇒ *Wherever possible, "catch-up" examinations should take place during the examination block, when the individual student concerned does not have a scheduled examination. These exams are to be organised with **Leaders of Pedagogy (Studies Coordinators)** on the occasion of the submission of the **Absence, Illness, Misadventure Form** to the relevant **Subject Leader of Pedagogy**.*
- ⇒ *Examination equipment may be taken into the examination room in a **clear plastic sleeve**. No pencil cases.*
- ⇒ ***Normal school uniform** is to be respected and worn to examinations.*
- ⇒ *The examination block commences on **Monday 19 June 2017**. **Normal classes will resume Term 3 2017**.*

Please do not hesitate to contact either **Mrs Cathy O’Gorman** or **Mr Ross Wilson** if you have any queries in relation to these exams. We wish all Year 12 students the very best for this formal examination block – the last of the “big blocks!”. Be your best, Year 12, and remember that giving of your best means preparing and working with commitment over the next few weeks.

Study Skills:

Making the Most of Feedback

Throughout the year you will have been receiving feedback from your teachers about your assessments. But are you making the most of this feedback? Many students are too focused on what mark they received and neglect to make the most of the feedback they are given.

It's not just about what you did wrong either! The feedback is a chance to celebrate what you did right, what you understood and the skills and learning you demonstrated.

However, it is also a chance to address areas you found difficult or did not perform as well in.

Below are some questions you can ask yourself when an assessment is returned to make the most of the feedback you are given.



When a test or exam is returned:

- ◆ *What specific feedback did your teacher give you and how should you use that feedback?*
- ◆ *Will you be tested on these topics again or are they important for overall understanding in this subject?*
- ◆ *Which areas do you need to ask for help on as you still don't understand?*
- ◆ *Which questions from your test paper should you re-do? Re-do them!*
- ◆ *Should you re-write any questions or essays and re-submit?*
- ◆ *Was there any revision work you did not complete before the test?*
- ◆ *What topic areas do you need to review and revise, what should you do to address these?*
- ◆ *Are there topics you still need to finalise study notes on?*
- ◆ *Are there sections of your study notes that you need to re-do?*
- ◆ *Did you plan ahead to give yourself enough time to revise?*
- ◆ *What changes do you need to make in the way you study for that subject next time?*
- ◆ *Are there students who did really well that you can talk with to find what they did differently?*

For other types of assessments:

- ◆ *What parts of the assessment did you do really well?*
- ◆ *What did you enjoy about the assessment?*
- ◆ *What can you learn from the feedback you were given?*
- ◆ *Is there any part of the feedback you don't understand that you need to discuss with your teacher?*
- ◆ *Can you ask a student who did really well if you can look at their assessment so you can see what is needed to get top marks?*
- ◆ *What could you have done differently?*
- ◆ *Do you understand what you need to do to improve or do you need to ask your teacher for more guidance?*

THE SHOEHORN SONATA

Last week, 44 Year 12 English students, along with Mr Doyle, Mrs Burns and Mr Wilson, travelled to the Impulse Theatre in Redfern to view a performance of the play 'The Shoehorn Sonata', written by Australian playwright John Misto.



This moving play is currently one of the prescribed texts for the Standard English HSC Course – Module A, 'Distinctively Visual', and featured veteran Australian actors Veronica Lang and Robina Beard who did a wonderful job of reprising the roles of Sheila and Bridie (Robina is perhaps best known for her role as Madge, the manicurist in the long running TV commercial for Palmolive dishwashing liquid!).

Year 12 were privileged to have the opportunity to view this text in a theatrical environment, as the Module asks them to analyse the text from a visual perspective. This excursion was an extremely worthwhile venture which will certainly enhance the students' understanding of the module, the text and its elements.



YEAR 9 GENRE STUDIES – 'WE WERE LIARS'

As part of the unit on 'Genre' this term, 9 English 1 studied the novel 'We Were Liars' by E. Lockhart. Although the text received a mixed reaction with this class, most agreed that it was an engaging and evocative read – with an astonishing ending. One of the quirks of the novel was the characters' fondness for writing 'mottos' on their hands, such as the one which shapes the book the most- *'be a little kinder than you have to be'*.

To finish the unit, we decided to take a cue from the novel, and write our own mottos on our hands. 9 English 1 spent an enjoyable lesson in the library, researching, choosing and discussing 'mottos', and effectively trying on a new set of ethics for a day.

(Most) of 9 1 English, can recommend 'We Were Liars' as an enjoyable, compelling, coming of age novel, recommended for readers 13 years and up. Oh, and if you do read this book, and someone happens to ask you how it ends... *lie*.





Are you up for a challenge? St Paul's will be organising another Vietnam Immersion program for September / October 2018 for students presently in Years 9 -10.

The Vietnam Immersion experience is intended to **challenge** students physically, and to expand student knowledge and cultural awareness - but it can also be emotionally challenging.

Students will need to commit to several days of a **social justice program** of assisting others less fortunate than themselves, and to **trek** with backpack for three days into a hill-tribe ethnic community village. There are several **home-stays** where you will stay with local villagers. You will also need to be able to **cycle and swim**. The program of travel planned will require the students to work and travel as a team member for 16 days and cost will be just over \$4000.

Want to know more? There will be a parent meeting late in Term 2 to gauge interest among students. An itinerary will be distributed at this meeting. Although Mr Wilson has retired from organisation, several other experienced teachers will be leading the school team.
