To the Families and Friends of the St Paul's Community.....

I would like to thank everyone for their best wishes over the past few weeks while I have been away. A small operation sorted out a little issue I have been having over the past few months and by all reports, all is good. I would like to particularly thank Mr Furey and Miss McVeigh for all the work they did in my absence. Some might suggest that I booked in the procedure to avoid the staff move into the new facility! There might be an element of truth in that....

Speaking of the new facility, the staff have moved into the refurbished study area and new lounge. It is a huge change from the old and one that we are blessed to have been given. It is fresh and clean and the new work stations are bright and airy. It's hard to imagine us in the old staff room now that we are in the new facility. It has been most pleasing that many of them have reflected that the exams have been a good challenge, one that is preparing them well for the final exams as well as giving them appropriate grades to go towards their overall assessment. There is much work still to be done with most subjects still to complete assessments next term and those students completing major works still in the midst of making sure that they have everything completed before the due dates next term. The coming break will be an ideal opportunity for students to refocus and organise notes as well as continue practice that will be vital as they finalise their studies next term.

St Paul's Day is fast approaching and this year we will be conducting a special fundraising exercise for our senior students on Thursday evening. Ms Heard and Ms De Winter have done a tremendous job organising our sleep-out that will highlight the cause of homeless people in our local area. The students will bunk down on the floor in the hall with no heating and they will have an opportunity to reflect on the reality that is faced by too many people in this very rich country. I would like to thank the Toronto Woolworths who have kindly not only donated breakfast but also volunteered in cooking for the staff and students who will be conducting the sleep-out this year.

St Paul's Day will follow the sleep-out on Friday. We will be celebrating our special charism with a liturgical celebration preceded by a smoking ceremony to highlight NAIDOC Week commemorations. The annual talent quest and staff versus student games, picnic lunch and carnival will be the perfect way to celebrate as a community who and what we stand for. A huge thank you to the Student Coordinators and particularly Mrs Lucas and Mr Doyle for the work done to make this day a special one for all our students. It goes without saying that days like this are what we do so well and that it is expected that all students will attend. We are a Catholic school and St Paul is our patron saint. This day is a most important day in our liturgical year and one that makes us unique, the reason why our parents have

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Another Term gone and we are now half way through Year 9. I continue to marvel at how well most of the year seems to be travelling. There will always be bumps in the road (sometimes deep potholes!) but there is a real community spirit among the cohort that keep each other on the correct path. I take this opportunity to thank the tutor group teachers for being the welcome smile each and every day, and for the care that they and all their teachers show for these great kids.



I have had to send out a few Uniform letters and detentions in the last few weeks. I truly hope that the uniform situation improves from the start of next term. All uniform deficiencies go back to zero at the start of this Term so everyone gets a clean slate. I am disappointed that some students continue to defy the uniform requirements blatantly wearing black socks, the wrong uniform, or the incorrect jumper without reason. I am baffled that some would prefer to go cold on winter days than to wear the school jumper, which has not changed since the start of Year 7. I encourage parents to continue to monitor the uniform please.

I am also mindful of the eating habits of some of our students – some do not have breakfast, others do not eat at school at all, others binge when they get home, others only consume lollies, or energy drinks. I encourage parents to continue to monitor their child’s food intake please. Suggest and help your child prepare a couple of small healthy meals/snacks the night before school, so there is no excuse. A reminder that energy drinks (Mother etc) are banned at school due to the health risks associated with them.



It has come to my attention, that a number of students are visiting IGA before coming to school. We would prefer students to come directly to school for their own safety, but are aware that some have parent permission. My concern is that some students are thus getting to school late, purchasing energy drinks and trying to consume them at school, are too free with tapping their card and spending unnecessary money, and hanging around shops whilst representing the school. I will leave it to parents to make judgements and to talk to their child about this practice. Students are expected to be at school before Tutor Group (8.40am) each day.


A reminder that in accordance with the letter that Mr Selmes sent to all Year 9 families earlier this year, that students will not be permitted to change **electives**.

Calling young Australians to be part of an international conversation


Young people across Australia are being called to share their views about life, faith, and their experience of Church through an online survey by the Australian Bishops.

The survey seeks to capture the opinions and perspectives of young people as part of a national consultation process that will inform an international conversation in Rome next year.

Pope Francis will lead the international conversation at the Vatican. Representatives from all over the world will be invited to Rome to share their experiences and views at a meeting in October 2018.

Australians aged between 16 and 29 years are encouraged to complete the survey. The questions cover a range of topics including: the experience of being listened to, using social media and technology, friendships and influences in today's world, opportunities for engagement with Church activities such as, outreach programs, youth masses, community leadership or parish events.

Developed by the Pastoral Research Office in collaboration with the ACU Ethics Committee, the survey can be completed online <https://www.catholic.org.au/youthsurvey> . It will run for four weeks, the closing date for responses is midnight on Sunday, 2 July 2017.

The **Australian Catholic Youth Festival** will take place in Sydney this December 7th -9th. Students from Years 9-12 are eligible and welcome to attend, along with people up to the age of 30. Bishop Bill Wright would like to personally invite each of you to attend.

Dr Michael J. Slattery, our Diocesan Director of Schools, encourages all our students from Years 9-12 to take part in what is anticipated to be a unique and exciting experience. The Festival is not just for young people actively engaged in their faith, or just for those who attend Mass every Sunday. It is aimed at all young people including those questioning their faith and those who are not practising at present. It is a wonderful opportunity to meet young people, have lots of fun, and to re-engage.

The organisers are expecting over 15,000 young people from all over Australia to attend the Youth Festival. The organisers are anticipating over 350 people from our diocese will attend, enjoying the live music, vibrant group sessions, various workshops, social justice service projects and much more.



St Paul's Day

The last day of Term 2 each year is celebrated as St Paul's Day.

St Paul's Day is a celebration of our school patron – St Paul.

The day begins with a liturgy which celebrates the story of St Paul and his willingness to live the gospel and create a gospel-centred community.

Following the liturgy Year 11 students run the annual "St Paul's Got Talent" Quest. This fun activity involves a wide range of students who showcase their talents to the whole school. A lot of clapping and cheering is usually involved.



After the formal part of the day is over, students will enjoy a series of food stalls and carnival rides for the rest of the day.

There will be no formal lessons or organised sport on this day.

This is an Out of Uniform Day and our policy on modest clothing will apply and appropriate attire for carnival rides is encouraged. Students will then be able to fully participate in the free sporting activities such as netball competition between staff and students, competitions and games.

There will be a small charge for the carnival rides. These rides include: the mechanical bull, large jumping castle, twister, bungee run and surf's up.

The food stalls that will be available on the day include a sausage sizzle, pizza, soft drinks, donuts, milkshakes, cakes and lollies. The food and rides are heavily subsidised by the School, however there is a small cost of \$1-2 for each food item and \$5 for 7 ride tickets. Students will need to bring some money if they choose to buy food or go on the rides.




