

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Recently I spoke with year 12 at their Awards ceremony about the importance of having a plan and setting goals. It is nothing new to suggest that a plan and goals enable us to stay on course in our endeavors, whatever they may be, it also allows us to reassess when needed to see if we are on the right path to achieve these goals.

Regardless of where each student is achieving at the moment, there is well-documented evidence to support the notion that what each student does between now and their Trials and HSC will have a significant impact on their outcomes. I challenge Year 12 to commit to and focus on their studies over the coming months, other areas of their lives should be pared back to allow students to increase their efforts and time on their studies. I encourage students to continue to have a balance of study, exercise, social, work, and family life. To give themselves the best opportunity to achieve to their potential then the bias in these aspects of their lives should be towards their preparation for the HSC.

With HSC Trials at the end of this term and then the final 10 weeks of school in term 3, the time is now for students to perhaps reorient themselves to their studies.

Earlier this week Year 11 and Year 12, along with their parents were invited to Information Nights. Monday night Year 11 was the focus with presentations on 'Supporting Your Child Through Senior Studies'. Mrs Carter and Mrs Shipman outlined some strategies and important processes for students and families to consider as they move into their 2nd term of senior studies. A general theme of the evening was to take time to think about what are the outcomes students want from their two years of senior studies, where do they want to be, what opportunities they would like to have, and then to put in place strategies as an individual and as a family to achieve these.

Year 12 students and parents meet on Tuesday evening, the information presented this evening had a different focus. Informing students and families on what to expect over the final months of their school life. A lot of the practical aspects of the end of school and moving into the various pathways that students have to consider were explained in detail. It was great to see to the number of students and families at this evening supporting each other and engaged in maximising the outcomes for their child.

Next Monday from 5:30 in the Damascus Center is another parent and student information evening. The Subject Expo evening is primarily about the courses the college offers in years 11 and 12. This allows year 10 students to build their understanding of what is available and what is appropriate for their level of achievement. Each faculty will have an area to showcase the course in their faculty. Teachers and Leaders of Learning will be there to talk with students and their parents about the courses and how they might relate to each student and their goal. Importantly, details of the process to select courses will be covered as well. I strongly encourage all year 10 students and their Parent/Carers to attend. The evening will begin at 5:30, at 6:30 there will be a 45 min presentation in the Hall. Following this, the Showcase will be on again in the Damascus Center. This will allow students and parents to choose to have the presentation at the end or at the beginning of their evening.

In presenting the above commentary I am conscious that for our older students there are certainly areas for them to be considering and responding to. I always encourage students and families to be aware that there is support in many forms here at the college to help students at any stage of their journey. Please have conversations with us if there are some aspects you have noticed or are feeling that have caused any concerns for yourself or your children.

Year 7 Aboriginal Storytelling Experience

On Wednesday 5th May Year 7 were able to welcome Elder Revd. Dianne Langham into our school. Aunty Di is from the Boandik mob from South Australia and spoke to us about The Dreaming, and the importance of storytelling for Aboriginal people.

Students from our Aboriginal Leadership team Antonio Multari and Jorja Powell welcomed Aunty Di with a fantastic performance on the clapping sticks while Damien Jolliffe played the Yidaki.

The storytelling started with Year 12 student Damien Jolliffe playing the Yidaki, he made sacred animal sounds and it was amazing. Then Aunty Dianne spoke about her culture, childhood, and current job. Aunty Dianne told her story of when she was a child growing up and the difficulties she had to face. We listened as she spoke of the Stolen Generation and the effects government policy had on her, her family and community. We listened as she explained how frightened and scared she felt as a child and how it is still relevant today for Aboriginal people. We all sat very quietly as Aunty Dianne told the story of "How the Birds got their colours" which was one of our favourites. Aunty Di also talked of her work in the corrective services.

Rev Dianne Langham talked about totems and she said that her totem was a whale and Damien Jolliffe explained that his totem is a goanna. Damien also explained how a Yidaki is made. Damien explained how you must make a circular motion with your breathing to make the noises in the Yidaki that you want, and you also must have a vibration in your voice tone.

It was a great experience.


