
Wednesday 29 June is the Churches nominated Feast Day of St Paul. As a school community we celebrated this significant day today. Originally known as Saul, the following scripture passage from Chapter 9 of the Acts of the Apostles outlines St Paul's conversion from being a persecutor of Jesus to one of his great followers who travelled around the Mediterranean Sea continuing Jesus' work, building Christian communities.

Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, “Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?” He asked, “Who are you, Lord?” The reply came, “I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.”

This information assists with the formation of the next Strategic Plan. The focus areas of the Strategic Plan are:


Sporting News
