

Recommended Reading for all Yr. 12 Students and Parents


‘**After the ATAR: Understanding How Gen Z Transition into Further Education and Employment**’ is designed to provide industries with insights into how youth are feeling about life, high school, the ATAR and the transition into further education and employment. This paper will align Year13’s findings with industry statistics to paint a vivid picture of youth engagement in the transitional landscape. This paper is comprised primarily of data mined from two surveys of Australian youth conducted by Year13 in 2017. These surveys were designed to inform communication strategies and to gain a better understanding of how industries could engage with youth more effectively.



RSA/RCG Courses 2022

(Responsible Service of Alcohol /Responsible Conduct in Gaming.

- **Responsible Service of Alcohol – RSA**
- **Responsible Conduct of Gambling – RCG**



These courses will be run after the HSC is over and before Graduation Night. They are accredited and nationally recognised. In fact, you must have these to work in the ‘club’ and ‘hotel’ industry and many of the local restaurants.

The RSA and RCG will be run at school on Monday 7th November & Tuesday 8th November 2022 from 8am until 2.30pm both days.

Students will also need to bring a valid photo ID on the first day and have their USI number. Registration is to be completed online for both courses and payment made to BARMAX training.



An Interim Statement of Attainment is issued to all students successfully completing each course and theory exam. Students then can obtain their Photo ID Card from **Services NSW (Old RTA)** at the completion of the course.

The cost to complete the RSA and RCG courses is **\$250 Total (RSA \$ 145, RCG \$105)**

For the courses to 'run' there must be a minimum of **16 and a maximum of 30 students per trainer**. Therefore, it will run on a first in best dressed basis. **Registration and Payment can be made online from Monday 22nd August through until Friday 23rd September or until the maximum of 30 students is reached.**

The Good Careers Guide goes on to state that 'Interior design requires an understanding of building construction, lighting, colour, and furniture. Interior designers may work

individually as consultants or with a design group.

They visit clients in their homes and offices, and can often work long hours, including evenings and weekends. They usually work for clients on an agreed fee basis.

To become an Interior Designer students must go on to further study after finishing Year 12.

At the very least, a diploma qualification is required, but students can also study bachelor's degrees in design, offered at numerous institutions.




