Female students will be asked to provide feedback at different stages throughout the trial. All girls are reminded our female staff are still available to support them if they need assistance.

#### Year 11 Course Awards and Student Conferences

Next week we will have the opportunity to celebrate our Year 11 students' academic achievements at the Year 11 Award Ceremony. These awards will recognise students who have achieved first in course through the Academic Excellence award, achievement in the top 10% of a course through the Scholastic Achievement award and the Diligence Award recognises students who approach their studies with a 'ready to learn' attitude and always give their best effort.

The awards ceremony will be followed by the Student Conferences. As students consider their pattern of study for the HSC year, these conversations between parents/carers, students and teachers help to create conditions which support our young people to thrive throughout this pivotal time.

Year 11 is often described as a practice run for the HSC, and in part, this is very true. The Year 11 course provides students the opportunity to develop patterns of study and revision and to establish productive learning habits which will enable them to achieve to their potential in the HSC. However, it is also important to remember that a practice run also allows students to recognise when they didn't get things quite right and to find out how to bounce back from adversity and challenges. It is our goal that each student experiences success in their learning and we know that success looks different for each student. As our Year 11 students embark on their final year of secondary schooling, they are encouraged to reflect on their successes and challenges over the past three terms and to begin to think about the short- and long-term goals which will enable them to realise their potential for the HSC and beyond.

#### **PAT Maths and PAT Reading**

In the coming weeks all year 7-10 students will be completing Progressive Assessment Tests in Maths and Reading. Students do not need to prepare for the tests and are simply used as a snapshot of learning. These tests are just one data point which Leaders of Learning and teachers use to evaluate their impact on student learning throughout the year.

#### Planning for Learning in 2023

Throughout this term the Leaders of Learning will be facilitating faculty planning days with their teams for 2023. The planning days allow faculty teams to evaluate and reflect on teacher practice and student learning and identify areas of growth for the faculty. As a learning community, it is important to recognise that teachers are learners as well and improve practice through critical reflection. A particular focus for each faculty will be the implementation of targeted writing instruction which improves students use of vocabulary, punctuation, sentence openers and connectives. Writing is a fundamental skill which, along with reading, has a profound impact on students' ability to engage in learning and to communicate what they know and can do. Students' NAPLAN results from this year show significant growth in this area.
