

Careers in Sustainability Engineering



What are Sustainability Engineering Careers?

Sustainability engineers tackle problems like climate change, population growth, and access to clean drinking water. Careers in sustainability engineering are about improving or creating things to lower our environmental impact and finding more sustainable ways to keep doing the things we’re used to. There are opportunities in water management, renewable power, biofuel development, electric vehicle manufacturing and more - it’s a very diverse field, and it’s in the top 25 emerging occupations in Australia (NSC, 2021).

What skills and strengths are needed?

Sustainability engineers need solid STEM skills and well-developed enterprise and employability skills such as problem-solving, communication, time management, curiosity, good use of ICT, and teamwork.

What are the pathways?

To develop the skills above, choose school subjects such as English, Mathematics (advanced if possible), Physics and/or Chemistry. And if your school offers them, engineering and environmental science subjects can be useful. Once you finish school, you will need further VET or university study to become an engineer.

UAC INFORMATION 2023

Upcoming deadlines – undergraduate

Schools Recommendation Scheme applications closing – **18 September**

Year 12 students who would like to be considered for an early offer through UAC's [Schools Recommendation Scheme](#) (SRS) need to submit their UAC application for admission plus their additional SRS application by **Monday 18 September**. There is no fee for the SRS application. The first offers to courses covered by SRS will be made on 10 November.

Early bird processing charge deadline – 29 September

For anyone wanting to apply for undergraduate study in 2024, we encourage you to complete and pay for your application before midnight on **Friday 29 September**, when the processing charge increases. Once you've applied, you can change your preferences as many times as you like, no charge! This deadline is not related to early offers – see below.

Early offers to Year 12 students

While the ATAR is still the main selection tool used by most unis, there are other ways for students to show that they're ready to succeed at tertiary study. This means they may be able to receive an offer to university before ATARs are released.

Early offers through UAC

The first UAC offers to Year 12 students will be made to Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) applicants on 10 November. Offers made then are not based on HSC results and ATARs. Instead, they are based on criteria like Year 11 results and the school's rating of the student. In some cases, they will be conditional offers, which means that the student still has to meet other criteria, such as achieving a specified minimum ATAR. Applications for SRS close on Monday 18 September.

Early offers from institutions

In addition to submitting an SRS application, Year 12 students can apply directly to individual institutions for an early offer. Each institution has different application and offer dates. Our website has a list of [institutions that have their own early offer schemes](#).



Whilst previously this was only open to Yr 6 and Yr 9 families, we will be taking orders from any students at St Paul's this year for 2024. Next Technologies are a leader in student devices and technology for schools with over 30 years of experience. They have worked closely with Diocesan schools since 2018 in supplying BYOD devices.




