Year 11 2025

Term 2 will begin the process for support students with their subject choices and study pathways for Stage 6 (Years 11 & 12). Please see below dates of the **Year 11 2025 Course Selection** program.

The evening will begin with a presentation in the Hall and cover: Meeting HSC Eligibility Requirements, Types of HSC Courses, Choosing HSC Subjects, Understanding HSC Pathways (including ATAR, Vocational Education and Non-ATAR), Disability Provisions.

Following this presentation will be the opportunity to attend information sessions led by teachers of HSC subjects. The information sessions will cover: Subject content, Assessment and information relevant to the subject such as Work Placement hours. There will be an opportunity for individual questions.

Prior to the evening students will be given a Senior Curriculum Information Handbook that provides detailed information on completing the Higher School Certificate and subjects offered at St Paul's Catholic College.

Taster Lessons Thursday 6 June & Friday 7 June Week 6 Term 2

Students attend taster lessons of courses they are interested in learning more about. The lessons allow for questions, address important information and provide some learning experiences that are reflective of the course content.

Year 11 2025 Interviews Week 8 Term 2

Every student and their parent / carers attend an interview at the college, focused on looking at the suitability of students course choices and eligibility for their intended pathway.

HSC Minimum Standards Tests

A key component of current NSW Education Agenda is the commitment to requiring students to demonstrate a Minimum Standard of literacy and numeracy to in order to receive the HSC. HSC students will need to meet the HSC Minimum Standard in three areas – Reading, Writing and Numeracy. The standard is set at Level 3 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF), which means students will have the basic reading, writing and numeracy skills needed for everyday tasks and future learning after school. It includes skills for tasks such as: following safety instructions in equipment manuals, understanding a mobile phone plan, writing a job application, creating a personal weekly budget.

Yr 10 students have the opportunity to meet this HSC minimum standard this year by sitting the HSC Minimum Standard Tests. If students achieve Level 3 or above in one or more of the tests: reading, writing or numeracy they will be recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that area/s. If a student does not meet the standard in one or more area they will have the opportunity to sit the applicable test/s more times before completing their HSC at St Paul's.

In determining if students meet the Minimum Standards via the Online tests, they will be subject to three 45 minute Online tests:

- a multiple choice reading test
- a multiple choice numeracy test
- a short writing test based on a choice between a visual or written prompt

Students will complete their first attempt of the HSC Minimum Standards tests in Reading, Writing and Numeracy early in Term 2.

Year 12 Mid- Course Awards

Congratulations to the students who have received awards at the Awards Mid-Course awards assembly on Tuesday. The awards are recognition of students' efforts, application and achievement over the past two terms, both academically and their contribution to involvement in broader community events. I encourage all students to continue to apply themselves to their studies and strive to achieve their best for the final terms of their HSC courses.

2024 HSC Written Exam Timetable Released

The 2024 Higher School Certificate Written Exam Timetable has been released by NESA. Students and parents can now check the dates and times of their HSC exams.

News from Learning Support

The Learning Difficulties Coalition (LDC) is a well-respected organisation within Australia. From time to time they have free webinars and this one is a great one for not only parents of students with additional needs but also parents of any school aged child, even adults. The webinar is free and is discussing executive functioning. Executive Functioning is a set of mental skills that we use daily, sometimes well, sometimes not so well. They include our ability to organise, plan, meet goals, follow instructions, stay focused, action self-control. This webinar would be helpful for all our students.



PRESENTER: ELIZABETH SINGHI SPEECH PATHOLOGIST

We all want the very best for our children, and this parent talk will focus on how to support your child to get organised and reduce chaos in daily life. Topics covered include: organisational skill building, tips on how to resist impulses and stay focused, time management, planning, problem-solving, managing emotions, as well as learning about metacognition.

These are all vital executive functioning skills we can help our children to learn - for children with additional learning needs and indeed for all kids (and ourselves too!). The tips are geared toward schoolaged children, but can be applied with adjustments to younger children as well.

Elizabeth will provide plenty of practical tips, and discuss ways to incorporate EF skills into your everyday family life. Plus there will be time for questions at the end.

2024 School Fee Information

School fees comprise of Resource, Tuition, Diocesan Family School Building Levy (DFSBL), Camps/Retreats and Electives and are the responsibility of parents/carers of students enrolled at the school.

Tuition Fees Year 7-10 \$2033, Year 11-12 \$3089

The Diocesan Tuition Fee is set each year by the Diocese.

Family discount on full rate diocesan tuition fees is available to parents who have more than one child attending a Catholic School in this Diocese.

- 1 child family 0% full rate
- 2 child family 15% each child
- 3 child family 25% each child
- 4 + child family 50% each child

Concessions on Tuition fees are also given to account holders of a current Health Care/Pension card. An application form must be completed along with providing a copy of original card.

Diocesan Family & School Building Levy (DFSBL) \$1638

The DFSBL is charged to the oldest child for each family. The levy is pooled to contribute towards past, present and future costs for building projects across all existing schools, and for the development of new Catholic schools within the Diocese.

Resource Fees Year 7-10 \$860, Year 11-12 \$810

The resource costs are set by each individual school. Fees are used to pay school resources, educational activities, student textbooks, various low cost excursions/incursions, photocopying, computer technology and amenities.

Elective Fees Year 9-12

Students who choose to undertake specific subjects, will be required to pay additional charges per year to cover specific expenses associated with the individual subject.

Retreats/ Camps

The Year 7 & 9 Camp and 10 & 12 Retreat are compulsory, and it is expected that all students attend as per conditions of enrolment in a Catholic school. Costings are calculated based on all students attending, venues and buses have to be paid when booking is first made. Your understanding of this would be very much appreciated.

Friday Sport Payment & Consent

For your convenience, you can now consent and pay for your child's Friday sport through Compass each Term. The account holder (name on your statement) is the only one who can access Compass to make these payments, if you would like joint access to Compass so both parents can make payments please complete and return the attached joint access form.

Account Statements

All fees are billed yearly in February, and it is recommended a regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalment is made from February to November to ensure your account is fully paid by 30 November, 2024. Our preferred method of payment is via Bpay (BPay detail are on your monthly statement) however fees may also be paid via EFT, Credit card, cheque and Centrepay. If you require assistance with calculating your weekly, fortnightly or monthly payment amount, please email finance@booragul.catholic.edu.au

2024 School fee account can be viewed at any time through Compass and updated statement are emailed at the beginning of each month. Families who have a nil balance will not receive a statement.


